

1 Tesalonicenses 2:1-8 (NVI)

Hermanos, bien saben que nuestra visita a ustedes no fue un fracaso. ²Y saben también que, a pesar de las aflicciones e insultos que antes sufrimos en Filipos, cobramos confianza en nuestro Dios y nos atrevimos a comunicarles el evangelio en medio de una gran lucha. ³Nuestra exhortación no se origina en el error ni en malas intenciones, ni procura engañar a nadie. ⁴Al contrario, hablamos como hombres a quienes Dios aprobó y les confió el evangelio: no tratamos de agrandar a la gente, sino a Dios, que examina nuestro corazón. ⁵Como saben, nunca hemos recurrido a las adulaciones ni a las excusas para obtener dinero; Dios es testigo. ⁶Tampoco hemos buscado honores de nadie; ni de ustedes ni de otros. ⁷Aunque como apóstoles de Cristo hubiéramos podido ser exigentes con ustedes, los tratamos con delicadeza.^[a] Como una madre^[b] que amamanta y cuida a sus hijos, ⁸ así nosotros, por el cariño que les tenemos, nos deleitamos en compartir con ustedes no solo el evangelio de Dios, sino también nuestra vida. ¡Tanto llegamos a quererlos!

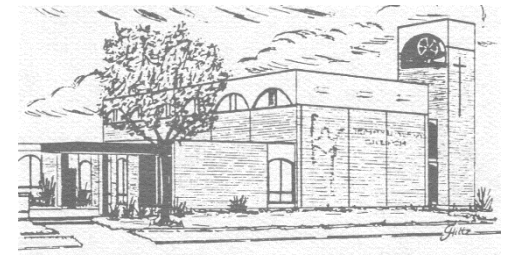

Deuteronomy 34:1-12 (NRSV)

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the Lord showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, ²all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, ³the Negeb, and the Plain—that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. ⁴The Lord said to him, “This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, ‘I will give it to your descendants’; I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there.” ⁵Then Moses, the servant of the Lord, died there in the land of Moab, at the Lord's command. ⁶He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day. ⁷Moses was one hundred twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigor had not abated. ⁸The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended.

⁹Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands on him; and the Israelites obeyed him, doing as the Lord had commanded Moses.

¹⁰Never since has there arisen a prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face. ¹¹He was unequalled for all the signs and wonders that the Lord sent him to perform in the land of Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants and his entire land, ¹²and for all the mighty deeds and all the terrifying displays of power that Moses performed in the sight of all Israel.

1 Thessalonians 2:1-8 (NRSV)

You yourselves know, brothers and sisters,^[a] that our coming to you was not in vain, ²but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had

courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. ³For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, ⁴but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. ⁵As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; ⁶nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, ⁷though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle^[b] among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. ⁸So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

Deuteronomio 34:1-12 (NVI)

Moisés ascendió de las llanuras de Moab al monte Nebo, a la cima del monte Pisgá, frente a Jericó. Allí el Señor le mostró todo el territorio que se extiende desde Galaad hasta Dan, ²todo el territorio de Neftalí y de Efraín, Manasés y Judá, hasta el mar Mediterráneo. ³Le mostró también la región del Néguev y la del valle de Jericó, la ciudad de palmeras, hasta Zoar. ⁴Luego el Señor le dijo: «Este es el territorio que juré a Abraham, Isaac y Jacob que daría a sus descendientes. Te he permitido verlo con tus propios ojos, pero no podrás entrar en él».

⁵Allí en Moab murió Moisés, siervo del Señor, tal como el Señor se lo había dicho. ⁶Y fue sepultado en Moab, en el valle que está frente a Bet Peor, pero hasta la fecha nadie sabe dónde está su sepultura.

⁷Moisés tenía ciento veinte años de edad cuando murió. Con todo, no se había debilitado su vista ni había perdido su vigor. ⁸Durante treinta días los israelitas lloraron a Moisés en las llanuras de Moab, guardando así el tiempo de luto acostumbrado.

⁹Entonces Josué hijo de Nun fue lleno de espíritu de sabiduría, porque Moisés puso sus manos sobre él. Los israelitas, por su parte, obedecieron a Josué e hicieron lo que el Señor le había ordenado a Moisés.

¹⁰Desde entonces no volvió a surgir en Israel otro profeta como Moisés, con quien el Señor tenía trato directo. ¹¹Solo Moisés hizo todas aquellas señales y prodigios que el Señor le mandó realizar en Egipto ante el faraón, sus funcionarios y todo su país. ¹²Nadie ha demostrado jamás tener un poder tan extraordinario, ni ha sido capaz de realizar las proezas que hizo Moisés ante todo Israel
