#### **Update from Angel and Blanca!**

After four months life is starting to get a new normal here. In the beginning the kids were very unsettled, but now they are making friends, getting the rhythm of classes. We got their first report cards and their grades are excellent, even in the subjects in Spanish. Angel and I are attending and taking turns to host and teach the bible studies small groups.

We are getting involved and getting to know the people that Dallas and Tara Wiebe, the missionaries who are part of our team are working with. The idea is for us to start new small groups as we get to know new people. We are already making some new contacts, though developing trust and starting a Bible study might take a little longer. Please pray for that.

Personally, as you might know, Angel got a gallbladder surgery and he is recuperating really well.

We just came back from Hermosillo, the city where my family lives. My father is very sick and doing very poorly. I went to visit him on August and he was in a much better condition, but last month the doctors found a tumour in his brain and their are not able to do surgery or any treatment because the tumour is big and intertwined with the brain. Now he is mostly in bed, with lots of headache and get disoriented very often. He is in palliative care on morfine and other medication. Please pass this to the church for prayer, so his pain may be lessen and that he would understand salvation through Jesus, I know he does but I pray that his faith is real and that he can have peace in his heart.
